Constitutional Amendment

Shall the following amendment to the Constitution be adopted?

1

Summary: Provides for only U.S. citizens aged 18 or older and meeting state and county residency requirements to vote in all elections. Further provides that 17-year-olds who will be 18 years old by the General Election are eligible to vote in the primary election, subject to the same citizenship and residency requirements.

Full Text: Section 1 of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Iowa, as amended by the amendment of 1970, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

Section 1. Electors. Only a citizen of the Jnited States of the age of eighteen rears, who shall have been a resident of his state for such period of time as shall pe provided by law and of the county which the citizen claims the citizen's ote for such period of time as provided by law, shall be entitled at all elections which are <u>t</u>horiz aw. However, for pur Jses election, a United Sta at least eighteen years next general rection follow orimary g ction The required periods of reside e st all not exceed six months in th and sixty days in county.

Constitutional Amendment

Shall the following amendment to the Constitution be adopted?

Summary: Provides that the lieutenant governor will act as the governor if there is a temporary disability of the governor. Further provides that the lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect will be the governor or governor-elect in the case of the resignation, death, or permanent disability of the governor or governor-elect thus creating a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor or lieutenant governor-elect, as appropriate.

Full Text: Section 17 of Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

Sec. 17. Lieutenap vernor or lieutenant governor-ele to become or act as governor or govern elect. If mporal disability of the there is a governor the lieutenant governor shall nor until he disability is act as gov removed, or the vernor dies, resigns, removed from office. In case of the esignation, or removal from office of the governor, the lieutenant goveror shall become governor for the ainder of the term, which shall reate a vacancy in the office of lieutenant governor. This section shall also apply, as appropriate, to the governor-elect and the lieutenant governor-elect.
